Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Vanguard Families and Friends,

This is a busy time of year for The Vanguard School. Our students and teachers are deeply engaged in the heart of the curriculum, and our administration is in the beginning stages of planning for next year. This is also a time for us to recognize the remarkable achievements of our students, and we have a multitude of achievements to celebrate.

Last week we received news that our junior high and high school students won ten Gold Keys at the Colorado Scholastic Art Competition, including a Best of Show/Best of Grade award. Vanguard students also participated in the All State Choir, and as usual, one of our students was selected for a solo. Our Vanguard basketball teams continue to excel at every level. Our junior high girls basketball team has only lost two games in the past three seasons and is poised to win another league championship. Our high school girls and boys basketball teams are also doing very well and have achieved some remarkable individual performances. Coach Joe Wetters won his 100th game earlier this season, and senior Seth Fuqua has topped 2,000 points scored, placing him among the top ten all-time leading scorers in the history of Colorado high school basketball.

At the lower elementary, our kindergarten students are perfecting their cursive and earning the title of Cursive Queen or King when they achieve mastery, and our K-3 students are receiving awards in both art and music for their hard work and character. At the upper elementary, our fourth grade students are memorizing all of *Paul Revere's Ride*, learning history, memorization, and poetry techniques as they do so. Our fourth through sixth grade students are honing their math skills and being recognized for their mastery of facts through quarterly math fact awards. Lastly, all our elementary students in first through sixth grade are participating in Knowledge Bowls in which they get to showcase the amazing things they are learning across the curriculum at Vanguard.

Our high school students continue their journey to graduation while preparing for life beyond high school. At this point in the year, our college counselors conduct individual sessions with each junior and their

parents to take an in-depth look at the college plan and how to achieve their goals. Our seniors are nearing the conclusion of this plan; 77 percent of our seniors have already received college acceptances, and the news of scholarships continues to roll in. Two of our students are finalists for the most prestigious scholarships in Colorado: the Boettcher Scholarship and the Daniels Fund Scholarship. Both scholarships not only provide full tuition, but they also provide leadership mentoring throughout college and lifelong inclusion into a very exclusive group of those who have won the scholarship before.

Our students achieve this success as a result of their excellent character and steadfast determination. Our success at The Vanguard School is the result of our entire community supporting one another. Parent support of our teachers and students, including students who are not their children, is outstanding and enormously encouraging. Student support of their peers and mentoring of younger students is life-changing for all who receive it and inspirational to all who witness it. Most importantly, the dedication of our teachers to the success of our students is felt at every level and is at the core of everything we do as a school.

Recent Exemplary Achievements

- Last year's Class of 2018, with 56 graduates, earned \$4,202,872 in scholarships.
- Over the past nine years, our students have earned over \$31,800,000 in college scholarships.
- Collectively, 14% of The Class of 2019 has earned recognition through the National Merit Scholarship program.
- The Vanguard School consistently ranks as one of the top schools in Colorado and the nation and has received recognition from *Newsweek* and *U.S. News and World Report*.
- In the most recently published report by the Colorado Department of Education, The Vanguard School is named as having the lowest percentage of graduate requiring remedial classes in college.
- Students from the 2010-2018 classes have had 52 members who have received recognition through the National Merit Scholarship program.
- In the last nine years, we have had sixteen National Merit Finalists, two Boettcher Scholarship recipients, and five Daniels Scholarship recipients.
- Sixty-four students took 135 Advanced Placement exams in the spring of 2018. The percentage of total AP students with scores of 3 or higher (on a 1 to 5 scale) was 92.2%. American colleges generally grant placement and course credit to students who obtain scores of 3 or higher on exams.
- The Vanguard School High School, Junior High, and Elementary earned the Colorado State Board of Education's John Irwin Schools of Excellence Award for Outstanding Academic Achievement. This year the high school also earned the Colorado State Board of Education Award for Academic Growth.
- Two Vanguard students earned a spot at this year's All State Choir, bringing our total students selected for this honor to thirty-one in the past ten years.
- The Vanguard School Singers were selected to perform at the 2017 and 2018 Colorado Music Educators Association Conference.
- Last year, Vanguard art students won two National Gold Medals for Self-Portraits, ten gold key awards, and two silver keys at the Colorado Scholastic Art Awards. Vanguard art students also won seventeen awards at the Congressional Competition and the Young Peoples Art Exhibition. See the Student Spotlight for fantastic news on this year.
- The Vanguard Matchwits team won the region again this year and has earned a place in the State tournament for eleven consecutive years.
- The 2018 boys basketball team finished 21-3 overall (11-0 Tri-Peaks League Champions) and advanced to the 3A State Tournament Sweet 16.
- The 2018 girls basketball team finished 14-9 overall and qualified for the 3A State tournament.
- The 2019 boys club volleyball team will be chasing their 4th straight State championship.

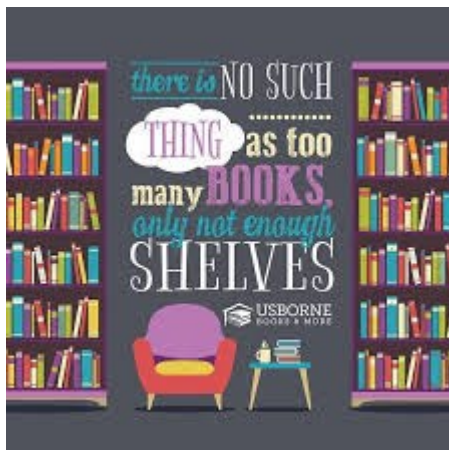

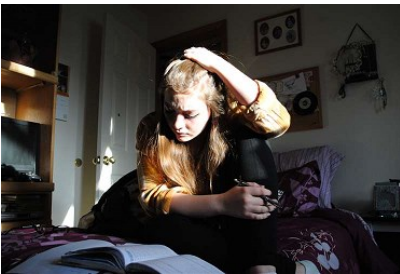

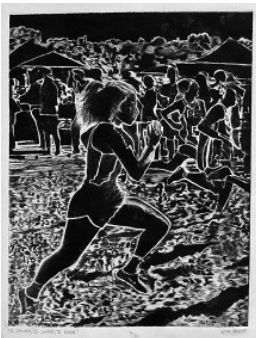

Student Spotlight

Seth Fuqua becomes the 11th individual in Colorado history to score over 2,000 points during his high school basketball career



Seth Fuqua started dribbling when he was 15 months old. Since his father ran the Hoops of Hope Basketball Camps, Seth went to his first basketball camp the week he turned three years old. He played against the kindergartners that year. As a young child, Seth attended basketball camps in Florida, California, Colorado, North Carolina, and New Mexico.

He played for the Vanguard Junior High beginning in 5th grade. From 6th through 8th grade, he led the junior high team to a record of 11 wins and 5 losses, with a 72 game winning streak.

Seth has started every game of his career at Vanguard. In 2016, he set the all-time freshman scoring record in Colorado with a total of 590 points and an average of 25.7 points per game. His high school points per game average is 24.7, and his current 2,174 points (as of 2/9/19) puts him at seventh on the Colorado all-time scoring list. In all-time scoring, he is also sixth for 3-pointers made, with a total of 288.

Seth's favorite Vanguard memory is traveling to Florida this past December to play in a national tournament and go to the Universal Theme Parks. Spending a great deal of time with his team, coaches, and family in addition to the games made the experience extra special.

He is especially proud that his greatest academic accomplishment will be graduating from Vanguard in May 2019 with a 3.6 GPA.

Scoring more than 2,000 points is Seth's highest individual athletic achievement, and his greatest team achievement has been making the playoffs the last two seasons. Seth's hope for the team is a state title win this season. He attributes much of his personal success to his phenomenal teammates and coaches. Thank you!

Seth's goals for college are to go to a challenging school where he can grow even more as a person and play college basketball. He currently has offers and interest from ten colleges and hopes to make a decision in March.

Violinist Jessie Zimmerman

Jessie Zimmerman has played the violin since she was three years old, and she started to formally take lessons, with Geri Arnold, at the age of ten.

She first joined an orchestra when she was twelve years old and attained the position of concertmaster. Jessie joined the Colorado Springs Youth Symphony at fourteen. She is currently in the Denver Young Artists Orchestra as the

principal second violinist. She has performed Shostakovich's Fifth Symphony, Mahler's Fifth Symphony, Holst's Planets, and more.



Jesse was selected to participate in the Pikes Peak Honors Orchestra in 2017. She was selected to participate in the Western States Orchestra in 2018 and 2019 and the Colorado All-State Orchestra in 2019. Jessie participated in the Manitou Springs Chamber Music Festival in 2017, where she performed the Borodin Quintet Number 1, Milhaud Quartet Number 1, the Smetana Quartet, and the Shostakovich Quintet.

Jesse has won several awards including first place in the Seoul Music Competition 2016 and third place in the Seoul National Music Competition that same year. In 2018, she finished in first place in the Seoul National Music Competition.

Jessie is currently the concertmaster of the Vanguard Ensemble and is studying privately with James Maurer.

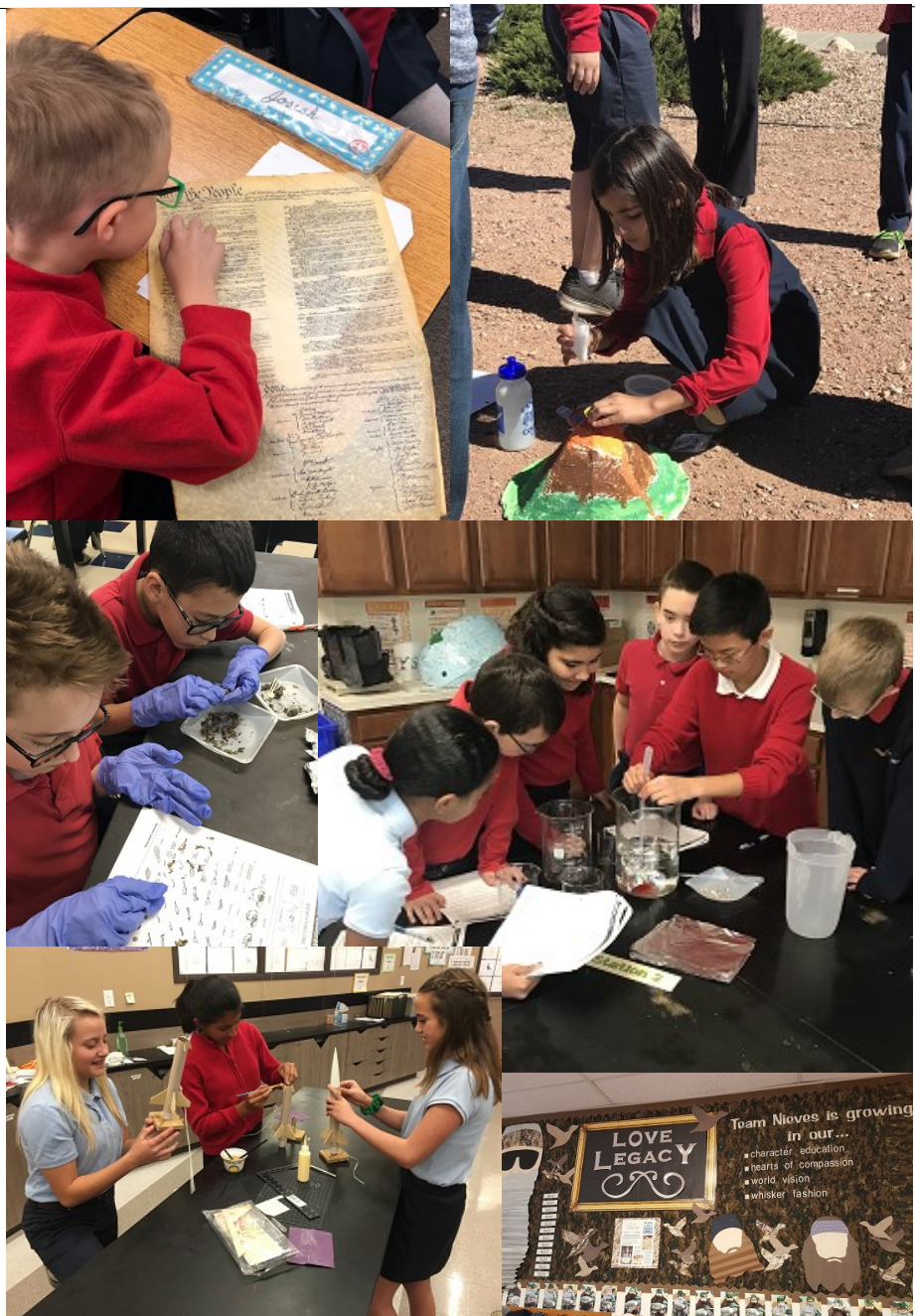

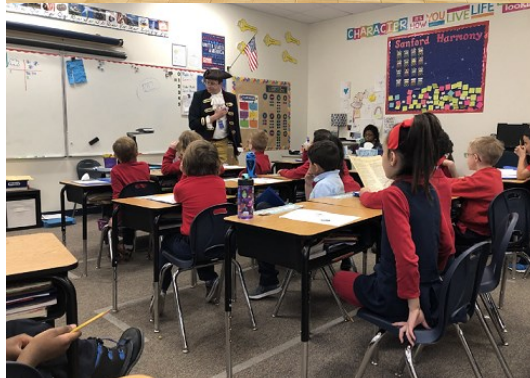
