#### MATH

The junior high math summer program has two tracks:

##### Course 1 (*incoming 7<sup>th</sup> grade*)

- **Three weeks/60 hours total (June 8 – June 26)**
- The three-week intensive Course 1 program focuses on bringing students to the appropriate level needed to continue to the next grade. This program covers the entire book and is appropriate for students who did not successfully complete Course 1 throughout the school year or placement test. A readiness test will be administered at the conclusion of the program.

##### Course 2 (*incoming 8<sup>th</sup> grade*)

**COURSE 3 (incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grade)**

- **Six weeks/60 hours total (June 8 - July 24)**
- The six-week intensive Course 3 program focuses on bringing students to the appropriate level needed to continue to the next grade. A readiness test will be administered at the conclusion of the program.

**ALGEBRA 2**

  - **CREDIT RECOVERY (applies to one semester)**

## MUSIC HISTORY

### 9-12 grades

- **\*\*\*Virtual/Online Format\*\*\***
  - *Instructor: Michael Robinson*
  - **Six weeks/60 hours total (June 8 – July 24)**
    - **Graduation Required Fine Arts Credit**
  - This one semester course is designed to help the student begin to understand the essential elements of classic western music history through an analysis of both the objective reality of music history and the subjective understanding of the student's personal musical style. Self-reflection and critical thinking from a musical perspective is enthusiastically encouraged in this class. While we will study music from pre-history to the present, this course is required for graduation.

## ART HISTORY

### 9-12 grades

- **\*\*\*Virtual/Online Format\*\*\***
  - *Instructor: Leighla Beteta*
  - **Six Weeks/60 hours total (June 8– July 24)**
    - **Graduation Required Fine Arts Credit**
  - This is a one-semester course that offers a chronological survey of Western art from the dawn of civilization to the modern era. Although there is an effort to involve students with images and ideas that lie outside the Western tradition, the larger context in which these images are discussed is Western. The course combines proper historical techniques and procedures with an emphasis on the unique position and role played by the artist and the work of art, its context, and the critic. Special attention is given to our interpretation of a work of art based upon its intended use, audience, and role in society. The course will also focus on how works of art shaped, and were shaped by western social, political, economic, and intellectual history.

## STAINED GLASS AND MOSAIC

9-12 grades

- **8:00 A.M - 12:00 P.M.**
  - *Instructor: Leighla Beteta*
  - **Three weeks/60 hours total (June 8 – June 26)**
    - **Elective Credit**
    - This course aims to help students expand their knowledge of art techniques and mediums through learning and mastering the basics of stained glass and mosaics. Students will utilize previous art knowledge and skills and expand upon them in their projects. Students who wish to advance their art skills to prepare for a collegiate or professional future in art will be better prepared through this class. Students have a choice between creating a stained-glass piece and a mosaic piece for the summer class.

## LATIN I (*current 9th graders*)

- **Three weeks/60 hours total (June 8 - June 26)**

## HISTORY

**8:00 A.M. – 12:00 P.M.**

- *Instructor: Alex Pirkle*
- **Three weeks/60 hours total (July 6 – July 24)**
- This three-week summer history course will be offered in July and is designed to provide students with one semester of credit recovery for either Classical or European History. The first half of each class will cover the broad outlines of Western Civilization—from prehistory through the early modern period. The second portion of the class will focus on strengthening essential research skills, including source evaluation, thesis writing, annotated bibliographies, and topic-sentence outlines.
